### **Composting Yard & Food Waste**

Composting is a natural process that  
transforms yard trimmings and food scraps  
into a soil like material called compost. By  
starting a compost pile in your yard, you can  
recycle your grass clippings, leaves and  
kitchen scraps into a nutrient rich material  
you can use in your garden or yard.

There are many resources available that can  
help you get a compost pile started; internet  
and local library for example.

The Manitowoc County Compost Site is also  
located at 3000 Basswood Road if you prefer  
to haul your compost materials to the site,  
but they do not accept kitchen waste and food  
scraps.

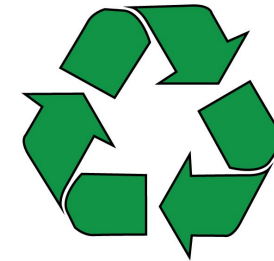

**Mandatory Recycling in effect in both the Town of Centerville and the Town of Newton.**  
**Your cooperation in making recycling work is very important.**



***Please have recyclables clean, dry and sorted with lids and bands removed.***

**Cans** • Tin, steel, bi-metal, and aluminum, should be flattened. Coated cans, foil and pie tins are acceptable.

**Cardboard** • Must be corrugated (brown on inside when torn). Should be clean and dry, flattened and boxed, bagged or bundled. Brown paper grocery bags can be recycled with cardboard. No white or gray board or cardboard coated with wax, tin, or plastic.

**Glass** • Separate glass by color—clear, green, and amber. No window glass, light bulbs, clay or ceramics, drinking glasses, or oven ware; this is considered garbage and must be put into a Town of Newton bag.

**Paper** • Includes newspapers, junk mail, magazines, computer paper, etc. Paper should be clean and dry and placed in a brown paper bag or bundled. No soiled paper, construction paper, paper coated with tinfoil, glitter, glues, colored with crayons, markers, or plastic wrapping paper. Wrap bundles in plastic bag if recycling in wet weather.

**Plastic #1 and 2** • No wraps, motor or cooking oil bottles. No bottles containing toxic materials. No dairy tubs or pails. Flatten containers and do not string milk jugs together.

**Aluminum** • Separate barrel for aluminum cans and other aluminum inside shed behind compactor.

**Batteries** • All types may be placed in the paper recycling shed at the Newton Site.

**Metal** • there is a large bin for scrap metal.

**Used Motor Oil** • Save in leak-proof container, barrels are inside shed to pour your used oil in.

**Plastic Bags** • There is a container for plastic bag recycling.

**GARBAGE COMPACTOR**

The Recycling/Collection Center uses a garbage compactor. Garbage must be bagged in clear “Town of Newton” bag purchased from recycling center attendant at \$.50 each; sold in bundles of 4 for \$2.00. Items too large for bags but small enough to fit into the compactor will be accepted for an additional fee.

*Examples • carpeting, building materials, window/ auto/plate glass, household furniture or accessories.*

**Burning Barrel Ashes** • Ashes from your burning barrels are permitted in the compactor, but must be in a “Town of Newton” bag.

**Yard Waste** • See Manitowoc County info on reverse side of this pamphlet.

**Hazardous Waste** • Collections available through Manitowoc County Clean Sweep Program on reverse side of this pamphlet.

**MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED**

- Hypodermic syringes or needles.
- Pesticides or fertilizers.
- Liquids including but not limited to antifreeze, oil paints and stains, latex paint.
- Yard or garden waste.
- Air tires—must be removed from bicycles, mowers, etc.
- Enclosed barrels, oil or gas tanks, pressurized tanks or canisters, sealed units, motors.
- Stones and rubble.
- Household appliances or parts of: Freon appliances (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, etc.), microwaves, large stoves, washers or dryers, furnaces, water heaters.
- Fluorescent light fixtures or parts of the same, transformers, ballasts, capacitors, condensers or Freon units.

*If you have a problem with these materials, contact the recycling attendant.*

**Brush** • Town of Newton residents ONLY may be taken to the Town of Newton compost site located at the old dump site on Newton Road approximately ¾ mile west of Center Road. The compost site is open the last Saturday of the month during Daylight Savings Time only. Town of Centerville residents cannot use this site.
